Friends,

My wife and I stopped in the V.P.C. on March 8 to get information on immigrating to Canada. We crossed Rainbow Bridge, Niagara Falls on March 14 and had no troubles at all. We had with us the required medical examination reports including the X-rays, and an application for permanent residence already filled out. Also, we had \$600 (but never showed it) and a transcript from U. Mass showing I had an M.A.. The Immigration Officer was very friendly (the crossing was even fun), and the Customs Officers ^{were} somewhat more businesslike.

The information we obtained from you was quite accurate, and we are much obliged for it. We have visited the office of the Anti-Draft Committee and they have compiled a small handbook which will be available at the end of this week (#2), and we'll send you one as soon as they're out. They suggest that interested persons keep in touch with them regarding "friendly" points to cross. Note their new address: 2279 Yonge St. Suite 15, Toronto, tel. no. 4810241.

At the border it was necessary (it seemed) to have an ~~address~~ address at which the authorities could reach us. We invite anyone needing such an address in Toronto to use ours and to stay at our apt. until they get settled; we live in the heart of downtown Toronto.
