The Hotz Algebra Tests for First Year High School students - because norms are available for Arkansas, white and colored high schools, (a typical southern state) as well as for Northern high schools.

The Iowa High School Content Examination - a battery of tests covering the fields of English, Mathematics, Science, and History and Social Studies; because norms are available for Utah, and other states as well.
