My dear Dr. Bond: Your plans for the Wilson family seem very sound. I don't know just where outside funds could be found to help in the rehabilitation of the family. My understanding is that the government is prepared to undertake the entire rehabilitation on farms of such families. I should think, therefore, that Dr. Alexander, acting not on behalf of the Interracial Commission but as an officer for rural rehabilitation, might be able to see this whole thing through. It seems an ideal case for the rehabilitation program: a family of proven responsibility and competence in dire need of a new farm setting.

The chief purport of this letter is to report that I am in complete sympathy with your plans and hope that the government may do the job.
